

'Fugenzo' but the flower colour and form is unique amongst all Sakura cherries. The flowers are quite spectacular, opening yellowish white/green which gradually turn shades of pink as they age. The flowers are borne about five per hanging corymb with most having 30 or more soft tissue like petals. A further attractive feature, displaying within the centre of the flower, are two leaf like pistils adding to the unique charm of this quite extraordinarily beautiful flowering tree. The flowers look like Japanese paper lanterns. The emerging double flowers appear with young coppery leaves which turn green as they age and then orange in the autumn. This variety will become a graceful spreading medium size tree. Absolutely stunning in flower!</p>

Dr. Joan Morgan, renowned pomologist at the Brogdale National Fruit Collection, was captivated by the beauty, uniqueness and mystery of the Treburrow Pear. After a careful examination, the fruit was sent for DNA testing. The results were as enchanting as the story itself—the Treburrow Pear was unlike any other known variety.</p>
